Key Responsibilities:

- Design high-quality visual assets for use across social media, website, email campaigns, and newsletters.

- Assist in the design of print and digital collateral such as brochures, signage, infographics, and event programmes.
- Ensure visual consistency and alignment with the summit's branding guidelines across all materials.
- Collaborate with content and communications teams to produce visually engaging marketing and press materials.

Preferred Qualifications & Skills:

- Proven experience in graphic design (**portfolio required**), preferably with experience associated with events, social media, PR and sustainability.
- Strong skills in Adobe Creative Suite (Illustrator, Photoshop, InDesign)
- Demonstrated ability to create visually cohesive and culturally relevant materials.
- Familiarity with African and Caribbean business, social, and cultural environments is a plus.
- Strong attention to detail and ability to work with a team, and independently across multiple projects and deadlines from a remote team environment.
